Message from the Mayor

At the last City Council Meeting, the City Attorney, Christina Benson, made a statement at the start of the meeting which was not recorded due to technical difficulties. This is important information that I believe all residents should know. The attorney has provided the following statement reflecting the same information stated during the City Council Meeting:

"The City Council identified a shortfall. The City Accountant located the cause of the shortfall and the amount. The cause and the amount were then confirmed by a third party. The shortfall is a result of a lack of accounting for something called the Fiscal Disparity Levy in the Certified Tax Levy. Residents will find, if they look at their 2023 tax record, that there was a significant percentage drop compared to the previous year. The result of the Fiscal Disparity Levy not being accounted for, is that residents were undercharged for taxes dating back to 2023. The shortfall amount, identified then confirmed, is \$178,197.00."

This shortfall did not cause any disruption to the day to day running of the City. All projects were completed as scheduled drawing from reserves. The micro-surfacing projects throughout the city streets were not impacted and will keep the roads in good condition. Rest assured that the budget for 2026 will reflect the Fiscal Disparity Levy.

The city has received numerous complaints about the use of e-bikes, ATVs and golf carts in the city. Complaints have been focused on the high speeds of the e-bikes, unregistered and unlicensed ATVs and golf carts, underage drivers and the use of these vehicles on the Riviera St. Levee (which is not allowed)! The posted speed limit is 20mph and applies to all motorized vehicles on all the streets in LSCB. Law enforcement officers have been notified and they will be issuing citations. To ensure that this program can continue everyone needs to play a part in following the ordinance!


